## FINDING EXOPLANETS WITH SMALL TELESCOPES

A Jupiter-sized extrasolar planet has been discovered by an observer belonging to the Astrophysical Institute of the Canaries, using a 4-inch aperture telescope.

Much larger telescopes have now begun to find extrasolar planets comparable in size to Neptune. The discoveries of three of these were announced in August.

# Sky Notes 2004 October

### THE MOON

First Quarter	20d 21h 59m
Full Moon	28d 03h 07m

### THE PLANETS

**Mercury** passes through superior conjunction on October 5<sup>th</sup>, and is not well placed for observation, even at the end of the month.

**Venus** continues to be a brilliant object in the morning sky. In the middle of October it will be 38 degrees from the Sun, and shining with a magnitude of -3.9. It will be 5 degrees to the west of the crescent Moon on October 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Mars** continues to be unobservable this month, having passed through conjunction with the Sun on September 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Jupiter**, too, is virtually unobservable, having passed through conjunction on September  $22^{nd}$ .

**Saturn** is increasing in prominence in the morning sky, and will be about 50° above the horizon at dawn, magnitude 0.2. With Castor and Pollux, Saturn will be part of an attractive trio.

**Uranus** and **Neptune** may be observed in the evening, Uranus at magnitude 5.7 being in Aquarius, and Neptune at magnitude 7.8 in Capricornus.

### METEORS

The **Orionids** are favourable for observation this month. They are at maximum activity on October 20<sup>th</sup>, with about 25 meteors per hour.

The **Taurids** also begin in October, although their maximum activity is not anticipated to occur until November 3<sup>rd</sup>. It is worth looking out for them in the last week of the month.



## NAS Observatory Meeting Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> October 2004 7.30pm

Our **7<sup>th</sup> October** meeting will be held at the **NAS Observatory site at Cotgrave reservoir**. Please do come along and see how we are progressing with our large telescope. If you have not been to the site before, it's a good chance to see what all the technical discussions at our meetings have been about!

Please wear warm clothing. There is almost always a cold wind at the site and space inside the dome and annexe is limited. A torch and a flask with a warm drink are useful items to bring along.

To avoid a large number of cars arriving at the site, the NAS committee recommends that members initially meet up in the car park of the "Lime Kiln Inn". This is a short distance along the road from the observatory site. And for those of you who have not yet been to the observatory, the Lime Kiln Inn is much easier to find (and very conveniently placed for a visit after the meeting!)

### DIRECTIONS

The simplest way to find the Lime Kiln Inn by using main roads is to drive to the A46 and head southwards in the direction of Leicester. Look for a Shell petrol station on the left, just past a set of traffic lights. Continue straight on along the A46 for another half mile, passing over the brow of a small hill past a "road narrows" sign. Then take the left turn signed "Colston Bassett 2<sup>3</sup><sub>4</sub> miles".

Drive along this road for about a mile and you will reach the Lime Kiln Inn on the right, next to a crossroads. (You will in fact have passed the observatory turning but it is difficult to find in the dark.)

On the map, the "PH" symbol marks the location of The Lime Kiln Inn.

Please arrive as close to **7.30pm** as you can and look for the group of NAS members in the car park. Committee members will be on hand to give lifts to and from the observatory site, between 7.30 and 7.45. The time(s) of return from the observatory to the Lime Kiln can be arranged on the evening, as those attending wish.
